

Role and Contributors of Authors

According to the ICMJE (International Committee of Medical Journal Editors), authors of a scientific publication must meet these four conditions:

- have made a substantial contribution to the design of the research (see list below)
- have written all or part of the manuscript at its different stages (initial writing, critical revision, editorial finalization)
- have approved the final version submitted for publication
- confirm the accuracy and integrity of the data and share responsibility for the study results and conclusion.

Each author must be aware of and take joint responsibility for the contributions of all other authors.

The following is a non-exhaustive list of possible contributions, depending on the type of study:

- design of the study
- bibliographic survey
- acquisition of funding
- definition of the methodology
- drafting co-writing or validation of the protocol
- drafting of procedures
- project administration
- execution of all or part of the study (e.g., conducting surveys, inclusion of subjects, clinical follow-up, therapeutic monitoring, performance of laboratory tests...)
- study supervision
- data analysis
- data validation
- interpretation of results
- drafting of the manuscript
- proofreading and validation of the manuscript.

Participants who did not make a contribution that would justify being cited as authors must be thanked in the section provided for this purpose.

The corresponding author, possibly associated with other co-authors, is responsible for the observance of these rules.
